An Act to Ensure More Equitable Hunting Opportunities.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as fol
--

12 MRSA §7457, sub-§1,  $\P$ A, as amended by PL 1981, c. 414, §31, is further amended to read:

A. There shall—be is an open season on deer in each calendar year in all counties of the State from the 5th Monday preceding Thanksgiving to November 30th, except that in any year when November 30th falls on a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday, the commissioner may, by rule, extend the open season on deer to the first Saturday in December.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide the means by which 16 the deer hunting season may be extended to the first Saturday in 18 December in any calendar year when the final day of November falls on Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. This ensures a full 20 final week of deer hunting opportunity and increases the potential for resident hunters to enjoy at least one Saturday of deer hunting on snow. 22 It also provides the mechanism for starting the traditional 4-week deer hunting season on the first Monday in November rather than in late October and thereby ensure 24 that hunting and trapping opportunities are more equitably 26 distributed among the various resource user groups.
