IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Exempt Military-trained Drivers from State Driver's License Examination Requirements.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRSA §581, as amended by PL 1989, c. 513, §5, is further 4 amended to read:

8 Before the operator's license is granted, an applicant shall be--required--to- must pass such physical examination and such 10 examination by actual demonstration or otherwise as to the applicant's qualifications to operate a motor vehicle as the Secretary of State shall--require requires. The Secretary of 12 State may waive any examination required by this section for any applicant who is discharged from the United States Armed Forces 14 and who held a military operator's license for motor vehicles of the same class as that for which the applicant has applied 16 provided that the Secretary of State may only waive an examination to the extent the examination is not required by 18 federal law or federal grant criteria for highway safety programs. Failure to complete the driving test within 18 months 20 of issue date of permit will-require requires reexamination for 22 the permit.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This bill grants discretion to the Secretary of State to waive an operator's license examination for former military 30 personnel who previously held a military driver's license.
