An Act to Simplify the Payment of Minor Workers' Compensation Claims.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:	
559	24-A MRSA §2365, sub-§1, ¶¶A and B, as enacted by PL 1987, c., Pt. A, §4, are amended to read:
	A. Deductibles shall <u>must</u> be available for indemnity benefits in amounts of \$1,000 and \$5,000 a claim, and for claims for medical expenses only in the amount of \$250 or less a claim, and such other reasonable amounts as may be approved by the superintendent.
	B. The deductible form shall must provide that the -claim claims for indemnity benefits shall be paid by the applicable insurer, which shall must then be reimbursed by the employer for any deductible amounts paid by the

of \$250 or less, may be paid directly by the employer.

carrier. The employer shall-be is liable for reimbursement up to the limit of the deductible. The deductible form must

This bill requires insurance carriers to offer a deductible in workers' compensation policies that would allow employers to pay out of pocket for the cost of minor workplace injuries resulting in no lost time and medical expenses of \$250 or less.
