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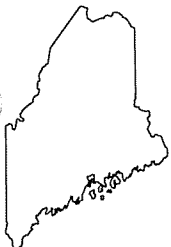

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**An Act to Make Allocations for the Administrative Expenses of the  
Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages for the Fiscal  
Years Ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993.**

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(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the State Liquor Commission become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1991; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

**Sec. 1. Allocation of funds.** In order to provide for the necessary expenses of operation and administration of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the State Liquor Commission, the following amounts, or as much as may be necessary, are allocated from the revenues derived from operations of the State Alcoholic Beverages Fund.

**Sec. 2. Allotments required.** Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor, based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures from these allocations on the basis of these allotments and not otherwise.
