RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Provide for a Uniform Property Tax.



	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each										
2	branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:										
4	Constitution, Art. IX, §8, sub-§5 is enacted to read:										
6	5. Uniform property tax. The following provisions apply to

10	A. By July 1, 1993, all property, other than property

16 18	B. By January 1, 1994 and annually thereafter, the State shall establish a statewide property tax mill rate calculated to raise the total amount of all municipal

20	C. Beginning with property taxes assessed in 1994, the statewide property tax mill rate must be applied to all										
22	taxable property that is assessed at just value.										
24	D. A municipality may raise an additional amount not to exceed 10% of the amount raised in that municipality under

28	E. Municipalities must administer and collect the tax and send all revenues, other than any additional amount

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal voters are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolution provides for a uniform statewide property 26 tax.
