### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolution, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Ensure the Financial Integrity of Any Public Mutual Insurance Company Established to Provide Workers' Compensation Insurance.

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**Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED:** Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

#### Constitution, Art. IX, §21 is enacted to read:

Section 21. Public mutual insurance company. All of the8assets and proceeds or income of any public mutual insurance<br/>company established by the State to provide workers' compensation10insurance coverage to employers in this State, or any successor<br/>company, and all premiums paid to the company and reserves or12surplus held by the company must be held, invested or disbursed<br/>exclusively by the company and may not be encumbered for, or14diverted to, any other purpose.

#### ; and be it further

18 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the 22 manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of 24 November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to prevent the expenditure of the funds of a public mutual insurance company created by the State to provide workers' compensation insurance to employers in this State for any purpose other than for the purposes of that public mutual insurance company?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice 36 by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, 38 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same 40 manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor. shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of 42 the legal voters are in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall 44 become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further 46

48 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town 50 and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This resolution is submitted as a result of a study on the feasibility of creating a state workers' compensation insurance fund, conducted by a subcommittee of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance. The resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to prevent the State from seizing funds belonging to the proposed Maine State Insurance Fund. The amendment ensures that money held by the proposed Maine State Insurance Fund is used solely for its proper purposes.

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
