26 MRSA §597 is enacted to read:

§597. Protection from unjust discharge

A worker employed by an employer in the State may not be terminated except for just cause. If the employee contends that the employee was discharged or released from employment without just cause and the employer denies the claim and it is found after hearing before the District Court that the termination was not for just cause, the employer is liable through an order from the court for the restoration of employment with back pay and fringe benefits. This section may not operate so as to conflict with any collective bargaining agreement negotiated with a bona fide union by an employer under the National Labor Relations Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits employers from terminating employees except for just cause.
