Election materials distributed and posted. after the materials are received and before the polls are open, 8 the clerk may open the packages or boxes of election materials, break the seals on the packages not marked "ballots," and use the 10 materials for instructional purposes. constitutional resolutions and statewide referenda, and specimen ballots in the voting room outside the guardrail enclosure. When

the polls are opened, or no more than 1/2-heur 2 hours before the opening of the polls, the warden shall break the seals on the packages containing the ballots and distribute the ballots to the election clerks in charge of them. The breaking of the seals on the packages containing the ballots is a public proceeding and any member of the public may be present.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill gives ballot clerks more time to correct an error in election ballots by permitting them to have access to the ballots 2 hours before the polls open. Current law permits access to the ballots 1/2 hour before the polls open.
