26 STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill transfers a data entry specialist position from
28 the Department of Finance, Bureau of Accounts and Control to the
Administrative Office of the Courts. The transfer results from
30 the review by the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program
Review of the effects of the implementation of the State's new
32 payroll, personnel and accounting systems known as the Maine
Financial and Administrative Statewide Information System, or
34 MFASIS. The committee found that new duties due to MFASIS
resulted in an increased accounting and personnel workload for
36 the Judicial Department equivalent to 2.8 full-time positions and
has required additional expenditures by the Judicial Department
38 for temporary data entry assistance.
