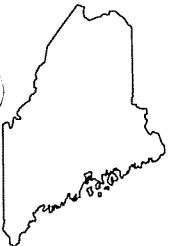

**Resolve, To Require the Department of Human Services to Inform
Certain Persons of their Rights.**



2 **Information sheet; preparation. Resolved:** That the Department
3 of Human Services and the Department of the Attorney General
4 shall prepare an information sheet, written in easily understood
5 language, that clearly outlines the rights of persons who are the
6 subjects of formal, informal or preliminary investigation by the
7 Department of Human Services, the procedures available to the
8 Department of Human Services and the consequences of those
9 procedures.

10 **Provision of information sheet. Resolved:** That the Department
11 of Human Services shall provide a copy of this information sheet
12 to a person within 24 hours of the department's receipt of or
13 acquisition of any information reasonably likely to result in a
14 formal, informal or preliminary investigation of that person by
15 the department.

STATEMENT OF FACT

20 This resolve requires the Department of Human Services and
21 the Department of the Attorney General to prepare an information
22 sheet for distribution to persons under investigation by the
23 Department of Human Services. The information sheet must inform
24 persons of their rights and the procedures available to the
25 Department of Human Services.
