20	Further amend the bill by adding at the end before the

24	'FISCAL NOTE
26	This bill imposes a limit on campaign contributions. The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices can
28	absorb the tasks associated with implementing the provisions of this bill if current staffing levels are not decreased. The
30	Governor's current services budget proposal for the commission recommends reducing a full-time position to part-time which will
32	impact upon the commission's ability to fulfill these tasks. This bill individually does not warrant providing an additional
34	appropriation. The required General Fund appropriation will
36	depend on the cumulative effect of all legislation affecting the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices.'

40	STATEMENT OF FACT
42	The amendment makes a technical change in the headnote of one subsection of the bill to clarify that the subsection limits
44	contributions by individuals and committees, not contributions by individual committees. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
