An Act to Require Notification of Employee Terminination.

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	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT
	§875. Definitions
	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise
	indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
	1. Employee. "Employee" means a person who may be
	permitted, required or directed by an employer in consideration
	of direct or indirect gain or profit to engage in employment.
	2. Employer. "Employer" means an individual, partnership,
į	association, corporation, legal representative, trustee,
	<u>receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, a common carrier by rail, motor,</u>
	vater or air or an express company doing business in or operating
-	within the State.
	§876. Notice of termination
	JUID. MOLICE OF CERMINALION
	<u>An employer shall give an employee at least 2 weeks' notice</u>
	of intention on the employer's part to terminate employment.
	STATEMENT OF FACT
	This bill requires that employers give employees at least 2
	weeks' notice of their intention to terminate employment.

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
