STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Make Allocations for the Operating Expenditures of the Intergovernmental Telecommunications Fund of the Department of Administration for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1991; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to cover specifically those adjustments determined necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature, and those reclassifications and range changes that have been approved by the Department of Administration and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

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Sec. 2. Exclusion. Exclusive of the provisions of sections 5 and 6 of this Act and of capital items obtained through lease purchases of other similar agreements consistent with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1587 and other applicable laws, up to \$750,000 for Capital Expenditures may be expended in each fiscal year of the biennium. It is the intent of the capital purchased Legislature that items through Intergovernmental Telecommunications Fund may not be given, transferred, sold or otherwise conveyed to any other department, agency or account, unless the transaction has received specific prior legislative authorization through the budgetary process.

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Sec. 3. Encumbered balance at year-end. At the end of each fiscal year all encumbered balances may not be carried more than once.

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Sec. 4. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that all departments and agencies be assessed telecommunication charges on the basis of uniform billing procedures and in direct proportion to the services they are provided. During fiscal years 1991-92 to 1992-93, a department or agency may not be required to utilize resources in excess of levels that have been historically found to be necessary and available in order to maintain the level of service currently being received to satisfy those assessments.
