## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 115TH LEGISLATURE FIRST REGULAR SESSION

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 445, L.D. 1189, Bill, "An Act Relating to Restructuring the Public Schools"

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16 Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§7.</u>" by striking out all of subsection 1 and inserting in its place the 18 following:

20 '1. School restructuring. For the purposes of this section, the term "school restructuring" means the process by
 22 which schools and communities make significant changes in the existing school structure, including the policies, roles,
 24 relationships and schedules that influence teaching and learning in the school. School restructuring recognizes the critical
 26 educational role of technology and integrates technology and technological systems in the classroom, in school governance and
 28 in school record keeping. School restructuring is based on:

- A. The development of comprehensive educational goals establishing community expectations for what all students
   should know, the skills they should possess, the attitude toward work and learning they should hold upon completing
   school and the role of the school in the community;
  - B. A formal appraisal of the basic structures that govern operation of the school; and
- 40 <u>C. A commitment to revise the basic school structure to</u> 40 <u>achieve the comprehensive educational goals.</u>

42 School restructuring, which is most effectively carried out at the local level, depends on community and educator involvement
44 and approval and student participation. School restructuring includes consideration of changing roles for parents, students,
46 teachers, administrators, support staff, postsecondary education institutions and officials, and various segments of the

School restructuring may include schools and school administrative units combining efforts to cooperatively pursue restructuring activities. When that occurs, one or more schools or units may be designated as demonstration sites.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>\$7.</u>" in subsection 3 in paragraph A in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 32 and 33 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>the</u> <u>pursuit of the program's plan</u>;" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>the program in its pursuit of a plan to meet the</u> <u>educational needs of its students and the staffing needs of</u> <u>restructuring schools</u>;'

Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 18 in the last 2 lines (page 3, lines 19 and 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "which that can eliminate their dependency on public assistance.; and" and inserting in its place the following: 'which-can-eliminate-their-dependency-on-public assistance.; and'

Further amend the bill in section 5 in the 2nd line (page 3, line 33 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "shall report in writing to" and inserting in its place the following: 'shall coordinate the preparation of a written report with information from the public and private organizations and entities involved in school restructuring in the State to'

Further amend the bill in section 5 by striking out all of 30 the last 4 lines (page 3, lines 40 to 43 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following: 'requested and granted and a 32 listing of the specific rules for which waivers were requested. The report must also include an assessment of the effectiveness 34 school restructuring, including recommendations on of how restructuring may become more effective, how replication of successful efforts may be encouraged and how dissemination of 36 information on school restructuring may be enhanced.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 40 statement of fact the following:

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## 'FISCAL NOTE

44 This bill calls for the Department of Education to encourage school administrative units to pursue the process of 46 restructuring schools to meet the learning needs and improve the . academic performance of students. It allows the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education to waive certain rules 48 when necessary to achieve restructuring and requires the 50 Department of Education to coordinate the preparation of a report

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to the Legislature on restructuring efforts. The costs associated with processing waiver requests and helping to prepare the report will be absorbed utilizing existing resources of the Department of Education and the State Board of Education.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

10 The original bill defined the term "school restructuring," encouraged the Commissioner of Education and the University of 12 Maine System to cooperate in providing technical assistance to schools and communities pursuing significant changes in the 14 structure of their schools, established waivers for schools and teacher education programs to enhance restructuring and required 16 the Department of Education and the State Board of Education to study school restructuring efforts and to report to the Joint 18 Standing Committee on Education.

20 This amendment makes several changes to clarify the original bill. The amendment revises the definition of school 22 restructuring to stress the importance of active teaching and involved learning processes in the restructuring process, to promote more community involvement in establishing goals for 24 restructuring schools, to clearly recognize the need for 26 expanding the role of schools in the community and to take into account the importance of technology in the restructuring 28 The amendment makes several minor revisions in the effort. assessment and reporting requirements of the Department of Education and makes other technical changes in the bill. 30
