An Act to Amend the Laws Pertaining to Pastoral Counseling Professionals.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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32 MRSA §13858, sub-§3-A, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 895,
4 §12, is amended to read:

B. Received a Master of Divinity degree, or an equivalent degree approved by the board, from an accredited institution or program approved by the board. Academic preparation includes a minimum graduate core curriculum to include 20 credit hours of counseling and human relations and 400 hours of clinical pastoral education;

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the requirement for the licensure of a licensed pastoral counselor. Current law requires that to qualify as a licensed pastoral counselor a person must have a Master of Divinity degree. The bill amends the qualifications to include that a person either has a Master of Divinity degree or an equivalent degree from an accredited institution or program approved by the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure.
