An Act to Increase Drug and Alcohol Abuse Treatment and Education Services in Maine.

_	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 5. Pilot substance abuse halfway house. The Executive Department, Office of Substance Abuse shall develop a pilot substance abuse halfway house for pregnant women and mothers with young children. The goal of the halfway house is to facilitate the transition of mothers and pregnant women from dependence on drugs and alcohol to healthy self-sufficient states in which they can support and care for themselves and their children.

Sec. 6. Project elements. The services offered by the pilot 10 halfway house must include stabilization of the chemical dependency of mothers and pregnant women, therapeutic day care for the children of the women participating in the program and 12 coordination of the vocational and educational development of the 14 women. The project must be conducted by an organization selected by the Office of Substance Abuse through a request-for-proposal 16 Criteria for selection must include maximum use of process. other existing programs in the service region.

Sec. 7. Evaluation and report. The halfway house pilot project must be conducted for 3 years from the effective date of this 20 The Office of Substance Abuse shall ensure that an Act. evaluation is conducted that assesses the achievement of the 22 project goal specified in this Act. The office shall present the 24 outcome of the evaluation and its recommendations in a report to the Legislature having standing committee of the joint jurisdiction over alcoholism and drug abuse matters by December 15, 1994.

Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

16 This bill provides funding for substance abuse services throughout the State. Funding is provided for treatment 18 services, prevention and intervention for adolescents, maintenance of existing efforts, equalization of services, 20 development and implementation of a halfway house for pregnant women and mothers of young children and treatment of correction 22 clients, including youths leaving the Maine Youth Center.

24 To fund this legislation, prescription drugs of abuse and schedule W, X, Y and Z drugs sold by prescription are removed 26 exemption currently from the sales tax provided for prescriptions; 50% of the funds raised from property forfeited 28 under court action for illegal drug crimes is directed toward alcohol and other drug abuse treatment and prevention programs; 30 and fees are increased for driver's license renewal and reinstatement fees.

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
