28	This amendment creates an express penalty for unauthorized taking of cultivated marine products from an aquaculture lease site. Enforcement costs associated with this violation will be
30	absorbed by the Department of Marine Resources utilizing existed budgeted resources.

34	The additional work load and administrative costs associated with a minimal number of additional cases filed in District Court
36	as a result of this violation will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. There will also be an increase in revenue to the General Fund from the collection
38	of fines in an amount which can not be quantified at this time.
40 .	Sentences imposed for a Class D offense must be served in a county jail facility. The projected cost to a county for each
42	person sentenced under the new Class D crime is approximately \$6,780 and is based upon an average length of stay of about 119

16	STATEMENT OF FACT
8	This amendment specifies that the express penalty created by the bill applies only to people who knowingly and willfully
50	engage in the unauthorized taking of cultivated marine products from an aquaculture lease site.
