COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "^A " to S.P. 468, L.D. 1251, Bill, "An Act to Raise the Family Allowance in Unemployment Compensation Benefits to a Reasonable Dependent Support Level"

Amend the bill in the first line after the enacting clause 18 (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) by inserting at the beginning the following: 'Sec.1.'

Further amend the bill in subsection 6 in the first 22 paragraph in the 5th line (page 1, line 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>\$25</u>" and inserting in its place the 24 following: '<u>\$15</u>'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §1221, sub-§3, ¶A-3 is enacted to read:

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A-3. Charges may not be made to an individual employer for supplemental weekly benefits for dependents paid in accordance with section 1191, subsection 6. Charges for such benefits must be made to the General Fund.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 468, L.D. 1251

Provides funds for an increase in the dependent supplement for unemployed school employees.

16 This bill increases the dependent supplement for unemployed workers from \$10 to \$15 per week per dependent and specifies that 18 for tax-rated employers these supplemental benefits must be paid from the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. However, most 20 state agencies, school administrative units and municipalities are direct reimbursement employers and will experience increases 22 in payments to former employees. The increased cost to the State may require additional General Fund appropriations for some 24 departments.

26 Local school units will also incur additional costs related to benefits for former school employees, estimated at \$7,700
28 annually. As a state mandate, General Fund appropriations to the Department of Education, Reimbursement for State Mandates of \$5,775 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$7,700 in fiscal year 1992-93 will be required to reimburse school administrative units for 32 these additional costs.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

38 This amendment changes the increase of the dependent supplement for unemployed workers in the bill from \$25 to \$15 per 40 child. The amendment provides that no charges may be made to the experience rating record of individual employers for dependent 42 supplements; instead, the supplements will be charged to the General Fund. The amendment also adds an appropriation and 44 fiscal note to the bill.
