The Facility Siting Board shall 30 consider the need for geographic distribution of facilities to adequately serve all regions of the State. The Facility Siting Board also shall consider in its site selection process the need 32 for landfill capacity to dispose of incinerator ash resulting from the combustion of domestic and commercial solid waste 34 generated within its jurisdiction. 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	This amendment replaces the original bill. The amendment

	Agency to conduct its site screening and identification process
6	and an additional 6 months for the development of the initial

8	statutory mandate.

10 The amendment also directs the agency to conduct 2 additional public meetings to provide the public with additional information and additional opportunity to discuss the risks and 12 means of managing the risks of special waste disposal.
