STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Ensure Proper Oversight of State Spending.

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Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

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Constitution, Art. IV, Part Third, §9-A is enacted to read:

Section 9-A. Financial oversight. The Legislature may authorize a joint standing committee of the Legislature to 8 provide legislative oversight of state finances. The committee may meet while the Legislature is in session and during the 10 interim and has the power to investigate and consider any matter relative to revenues, budgets, appropriations, allocations, 12 expenditures, finances or any other fiscal matter of the State. Any financial order or other action transferring or accepting 14 funds or that otherwise varies the terms of a duly enacted appropriations law is subject to the prior approval of the 16 committee.

; and be it further

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

30 "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature to provide for legislative
 32 oversight of state finances?"

34 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square 36 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, 38 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor 40 shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor 42 shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be 44 it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This resolution proposes an amendment to the Constitution of Maine that allows the Legislature to exercise continuing
6 financial oversight powers and to delegate them to a joint standing committee. Financial orders or other actions that vary
8 the terms of an enacted appropriation would require the prior approval of the committee. This is a companion measure to LR
10 1812 that enacts statutory changes to effectuate the constitutional amendment. Those statutory changes are contingent
12 on voter ratification of this measure.

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
