22	'Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§1873." in the last line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Class D" and inserting in its place the
24	following: 'Class E'
26	Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:
28	'FISCAL NOTE
30	This bill prohibits games of skill that involve the breaking
3 2	of glass and creates a new Class E crime. The additional work load and administrative costs associated with these few cases
34	will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department.
36	Sentences imposed for a Class E offense must be served in a
38	county jail facility. The projected cost to a county for each

person sentenced under the new Class E crime is approximately

\$3,820 and is based on an average length of stay of 67 days.' '
