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

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Strengthen the Laws Relating to Junkyard Cleanups.



Вe	it	enacted	by	the	Peop	le o	of the	State	of	Maine	as	follows:

30-A MRSA §3753-A is enacted to read:

§3753-A. Restoration by permittee

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Within 90 days of the revocation of a permit issued pursuant to section 3753, or within 90 days of the expiration of such a permit that is not subsequently renewed, the permittee shall clean up and restore the premises to their natural condition. Failure to clean up and restore the premises constitutes a violation of this subchapter.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill requires operators of automobile graveyards and junkyards to restore the premises to their natural condition within 90 days of the revocation or expiration of the permits issued for those yards. Failure to comply with this requirement is a civil violation, subject to a minimum penalty of \$100 per day and a maximum penalty of \$2500 per day.
