IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Facilitate Review of Applications Submitted to The Department of Environmental Protection.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

38 MRSA §344, sub-§10 is enacted to read:

 10. Extra-departmental review. Not later than January 1,
1992, the commissioner shall establish by rule a procedure permitting review of applications or portions of applications by
individuals, partnerships, firms or corporations qualified to perform such a review when effective and efficient administration
of the environmental permitting process permits. The applicant shall pay the full cost of the review authorized by this
subsection. The rules must:

14 A. Establish standards of qualification for an individual, partnership, firm or corporation performing the reviews;

<u>B. Establish a method for selection of the individual,</u> partnership, firm or corporation to perform the review of a particular application; and

<u>C. Establish standards of design, construction or use</u> necessary to minimize or avoid environmental impacts.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill directs the Commissioner of Environmental Protection to establish a procedure by which an applicant for a permit may request a review by qualified professionals outside the department of all or part of the application. It is designed to relieve some of the backlog in the department.

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The commissioner is directed to adopt rules governing the selection of outside professionals and the standards of the review they will be required to follow. The bill extends the current practice now used by the department for review of portions of applications by several soil and water conservation districts.

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
