made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this
resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive
Director of the Legislative Council upon making the
appointments. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call
the first meeting of the commission no later than July 1, 1991.
The commission shall select a chair from among its legislative

- Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That, in conducting the study, the commission shall:
- l. Identify and present a clear discussion of the federal and state laws and agency rules that apply to the siting, licensing, construction and operation of coal-fired power plants in this State;

- 18 2. Identify any obstacles posed by those laws and rules to the use of the best available technology in coal-fired combustion 20 systems, environmental controls and ash disposal;
- 3. Assess the extent and adequacy provided by those laws and rules for the examination of alternative methods of power supply; and
- 4. Assess the extent and adequacy provided by those laws and rules for public input into the siting, licensing and construction of coal-fired facilities.

In examining these questions, the commission shall conduct 2 public hearings, one of which must be held in Hancock County, and may seek expert administrative, economic or legal analysis or testimony, or procure and analyze data from any source the commission determines appropriate; and be it further

- Sec. 5. Staffing. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative Council and may request additional staff assistance from the Department of Environmental Protection or the Public Utilities Commission. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it further
 - Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission are entitled to receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further
- Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That, the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation,

2	to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature and the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council no later than November 1, 1991; and be it further
