An Act to Modify the Radiation Protection Laws.

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Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §666, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 519, §1, is amended to read:

- 2. Reports. The State Nuclear Safety Inspector, with the cooperation of the Director of Health Engineering, shall prepare a report of his activities under this chapter to be submitted January July 1st of each year to the State Nuclear Safety Advisor and the Legislature. The State Nuclear Safety Inspector shall prepare monthly reports for the State Nuclear Safety Advisor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, with copies to the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the licensee.
- Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §682, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1987, c. 519, §8, is further amended to read:
- Authorized. The department or its duly representatives may enter at all reasonable 20 times upon any private or public property for the purpose of determining whether 22 ex-met there is compliance with or violation of the provisions of this Act and the rules issued thereunder, except that entry into 24 areas under the jurisdiction of the Federal Government or its duly designated representative shall be subject-to-section-684 and-Title-25,--sections--51-and-52,--which-are-incorporated-by 26 reference-as-provisions-of-this-chapter effected only with the concurrence of the Federal Government or its duly designated 28 representative.

32 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill changes the due date of the yearly report from the State Nuclear Safety Inspector to July 1st of every year in order to allow the inclusion of necessary data that is not available from the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission and Maine Yankee until February or March of each year.

This bill also corrects previous language that was in error regarding the inspection of federal facilities. Under the proposal, federal facilities will be inspected only after prior notice.

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
