16	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 2 and 3 and inserting in their place the following:
18	'Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §2264, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
20	6. Helium-filled balloons. Except as provided in this
22	subsection, by intentionally releasing one or more helium-filled balloons outdoors. A person is not in violation of this
24	subsection if that person intentionally releases a helium-filled balloon that carries scientific instrumentation or that is used
26	for meteorological observation. A person violating this subsection is subject to the penalties set forth under section
28	2264-A, subsection 1.

32	FISCAL NOTE
34	This bill imposes a penalty for the release of one or more helium-filled balloons. The additional work load and
36	administrative costs associated with a minimal number of additional cases filed in District Court as a result of this
38	violation will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. There will also be a minor increase in
10	General Fund revenue from the collection of additional fines.'

16	This amendment makes the intentional outdoor release of any

- helium-filled balloon a civil violation, subject to a fine of not less than \$25 for the first violation and not less than \$100 for subsequent violations. Helium-filled balloons released for
- 4 scientific or meteorological purposes are exempt from the prohibition. The amendment strikes provisions in the bill that
- 6 established one penalty for the intentional release of 10 to 100 balloons and another penalty for the release of more than 100

8 ballooms.
