An Act to Reduce Littering.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §2264, sub-§§4 and 5, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 820, $\S4$, are amended to read:

4. Vehicle or trailer. From a trailer or vehicle that is constructed, loaded or uncovered in such a way that the load may drop, sift, leak or otherwise escape. This subsection applies to vehicles or trailers carrying trash, rubbish or other materials 10 that may be construed as "litter"; of

Vehicle operator. From a vehicle. When any litter is 12 5. thrown or discarded from a vehicle, both the operator of the vehicle, unless it is a vehicle being used for the carriage of 14 passengers for hire, and the person actually disposing of the 16 litter are in violation of this section. The violation is punishable as a traffic infraction under Title 29, chapter 19. This penalty is in addition to any penalty under section 2264-A. 18

A record of a violation of this subsection must be forwarded to 20 the Secretary of State who, in accordance with Title 29, section 2304, shall add the violation to the department's point system 22 and the violation is counted in determining an individual's total points under the point system of the Division of Motor Vehicles-: 24 or

б. Helium-filled balloons. Release more than 10 helium-filled balloons into the air at one time. 30

Sec. 3. 17 MRSA §2264-A, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 820, §5, is amended to read:

§2264-A. Penalties

Unless otherwise indicated, a person who disposes of litter or who releases helium balloons in violation of this chapter 38 commits a civil violation for which the following forfeitures 40 apply.

Disposal of less than 15 pounds or less than 27 cubic 42 feet of litter. A person who disposes of less than 15 pounds or 44 less than 27 cubic feet of litter or who releases more than 10 but fewer than 100 helium-filled balloons at one time is subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$200 nor less than \$25 for the 46 first violation and a forfeiture of not more than \$500 nor less than \$100 for a subsequent violation. 48

Disposal of more than 15 pounds or more than 27 cubic 50 2. feet of litter. A person who disposes of more than 15 pounds or 52 more than 27 cubic feet of litter or who releases more than 100

helium-filled balloons at one time is subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500 nor less than \$200 for the first violation and 2. not more than \$1,000 nor less than \$500 for a subsequent violation.

б 3. Disposal of more than 500 pounds or more than 100 cubic feet of litter for a commercial purpose. A person who disposes of more than 500 pounds or more than 100 cubic feet of litter for 8 a commercial purpose is subject to the penalties under Title 38, 10 section 349.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill imposes a penalty for the release of more than 10 helium-filled balloons within the laws governing litter control. 16 The penalty is increased for the release of more than 100 18 helium-filled balloons.
