An Act to Amend the Sunday Sales Laws.

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## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

17 MRSA §3204, 2nd ¶, as amended by IB 1989, c. 2, is 4 further amended to read:

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This section shall does not apply to: The operation or 6 maintenance of common, contract and private carriers; taxicabs; R airplanes; newspapers; radio and television stations; hotels, motels, rooming houses, tourist and trailer camps; restaurants; garages and motor vehicle service stations; retail monument 10 dealers; automatic laundries; machines that vend anything of value, including, but not limited to, a product, money or 12 service; a satellite facility approved by the Superintendent of Banking under Title 9-B; or a comparable facility approved by the 14 appropriate federal authority; pharmacies; greenhouses; seasonal stands engaged in sale of farm produce, dairy products, sea-food 16 seafood or Christmas trees; public utilities; industries normally kept in continuous operations, including, but not limited to, 18 pulp and paper plants and textile plants; processing plants handling agricultural produce or products of the sea; ship 20 chandleries; marinas; establishments primarily selling boats, boating equipment, sporting equipment, souvenirs and novelties; 22 motion picture theatres; public dancing; sports and athletic events; bowling alleys; displaying or exploding fireworks, under 24 Title 8, chapter 9; musical concerts; religious, educational, philosophical 26 scientific or lectures; scenic, historic, recreational and amusement facilities; real estate brokers and 28 real estate salesmen sales representatives; mobile home brokers and mobile home salesmen sales representatives; provided that this section shall does not exempt the businesses or facilities 30 specified in sections 3205 and 3207 from closing in any municipality until the requirements of those sections have been 32 met; stores wherein no more than 5 persons, including the proprietor, are employed in the usual and regular conduct of 34 business; stores which have no more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space, excluding back room storage, 36 office and processing space; and stores with more than 5,000 38 square feet of interior customer selling space which engage in retail sales and which do not require, as a condition of employment, that their employees work on Sundays. In-no-event, 40 however, -- shall--any-store-having-more-than--5,000-square-feet-of interior---customer---selling---space---be---open---en---Easter---Day, 42 Thanksgiving--Day--and--Christmas--Day- A retail store that is exempted from this section solely by virtue of its having more 44 than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space may not be open before the hour of noon or after the hour of 5:00 p.m. on 46 Sunday and may not be open at all on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day 48 and Christmas Day.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill limits the hours of operation of retail stores of more than 5,000 square feet of selling space, which were recently exempted from the Sunday sales laws, to noon to 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.
