At least 20 days 22 prior to the adoption of any rule without hearing, the agency shall deliver or mail written notice to: 24 Any person specified by the statute authorizing the rulemaking; 26 Any person who has filed within the past year a written 28 request with the agency for notice of rulemaking; and 30 Any trade, industry, professional, interest group or regional publication that the agency deems considers 32 effective in reaching the persons affected. 34 Notification to subscribers under paragraph B shall must be by mail or otherwise in writing to the last address provided to the 36 agency by that person. Subscribers under paragraph B may request 38 to receive a copy of each proposed rule and a copy of the economic impact analysis statement prepared under section 8052, subsection 5-B with the written notice. The agency shall provide 40 the eepy copies at the same time the notice is sent. 42 Written notice shall must also be given to the Office of the

In addition, General Fund appropriations and Highway Fund
allocations will be required by other state agencies for the
staffing and contractual costs related to the preparation of
economic impact statements on proposed rules. The amount of
appropriations and allocations needed can not be estimated at
this time.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment requires that a copy of the economic impact analysis accompany the copy of any rule sent to people requesting a copy of the rule. It also reduces the number of signatures needed to apply for a review of a rule from 100 to 25. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
