30	<u>§18901. Definitions</u>
32	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
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36	<ol> <li>Board of directors. "Board of directors" means the Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System Board of Directors.</li> </ol>
38	<b>2. Board of trustees.</b> "Board of trustees" means the Board of Trustees of the Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System.
40	3. Call firefighter. "Call firefighter" means a person who
42	is employed as a firefighter on a part-time basis or who is an on-call member of a member fire department.
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46	<b>4. Continuous service.</b> "Continuous service" means gualified service without interruption, as certified by the board
	of directors, except that:

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A. A member firefighter does not accrue gualified service while on active duty as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, but upon again becoming a member of a member fire department within 90 days of separation from the Armed Forces, gualified service before and after active duty in the Armed Forces is deemed to be continuous;

B. A member firefighter who terminates service with a member fire department and resumes service with the same member fire department within 60 days does not accrue qualified service during the interim, but qualified service before and after that period of time is deemed to be continuous; and

16 C. A member firefighter who terminates service with a member fire department and resumes service with another
 18 member fire department within 6 months does not accrue qualified service during the interim, but qualified service
 20 before and after that period of time is deemed to be continuous.

5. Firefighter. "Firefighter" means a call firefighter as defined in subsection 1 or a volunteer firefighter as defined in Title 30-A, section 3151, subsection 4.

 6. Governing body. "Governing body" means the legislative
 28 body of any municipality within which a municipal fire department subject to the provisions of this chapter is situated or the
 30 board of directors of an incorporated volunteer firefighters association.

 <u>7. Member fire department.</u> "Member fire department" means
 34 <u>a municipal fire department or an incorporated volunteer</u> firefighters association that participates in the system.

8. Member firefighter. "Member firefighter" means a
 firefighter who participates in the system.

 40 <u>9. Municipal fire department.</u> "Municipal fire department" has the same meaning as defined in Total 30-A, section 3151,
 42 subsection 1.

44 **10. Prior service.** "Prior service" means qualified service before the date of establishment of the system.

11.Qualified service."Qualified service" means48firefighting service rendered by a member firefighter who<br/>participates in at least 36 hours of recorded training, as

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described in Title 26, section 2102, during a calendar year while a member in good standing of a member fire department.

12. Retirement age. "Retirement age" means age 60.

**13. System.** "System" means the Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System.

#### <u>§18902. Name; date of establishment; purpose</u>

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The system is established and has the powers and privileges 12 of a corporation. The system provides retirement benefits under this chapter for member firefighters.

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#### <u>§18903. Fund established</u>

The Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System Fund is established in which must be accumulated all money credited by the State required for the payment of pension benefits as described in section 18919.

#### 22 §18904. Exemption from taxation and execution

 A person's right to a retirement allowance, any optional benefit or death benefit or any other right accrued or accruing
 to any person under this chapter and the money in the fund created under this chapter are exempt from any state, county or
 municipal tax to the same extent that exists in the Maine State Retirement System and are not subject to execution, garnishment,
 attachment or other process, except as provided by this section. These rights are unassignable, except as provided by this chapter.
 A member firefighter's retirement allowance is available to
 satisfy any child support obligation that is otherwise

34 <u>satisfy any child support obligation that is otherwise</u> <u>enforceable by execution, garnishment, attachment, assignment or</u> 36 <u>other process.</u>

#### 38 **§18905.** Board of trustees

 40 The board of trustees consists of those persons who are members of the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement
 42 System. The board of trustees is responsible for the proper operation and implementation of the system under this chapter.

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Duties. The board of trustees has the same duties with
 respect to the system as the Board of Trustees of the Maine State
 Retirement System has with respect to the Maine State Retirement
 System, including, but not limited to, those powers and duties
 enumerated in chapter 421, subchapters III to V.

2. System administration. The board of trustees shall administer the system and may adopt and publish, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, chapter 375, subchapter II, any rules necessary and proper to give effect to the intent, purposes and provisions of this chapter.

3. Expenses. Trustees are entitled to compensation from system funds as provided in chapter 379.

4. Oath. Each trustee shall, within 10 days after the
 effective date of this chapter and, thereafter, within 10 days after the trustee's appointment or election, take an oath of
 office to faithfully discharge the duties of a trustee, in the form prescribed by the Constitution of Maine. The oath must be
 subscribed to by the trustee making it, certified by the officer before whom it is taken and immediately filed in the office of
 the Secretary of State.

20 5. Quorum. Each voting trustee is entitled to one vote on the board of trustees. Four trustees constitute a guorum for the transaction of any business. Four votes are required for any resolution or action by the board of trustees at any meeting of the board of trustees.

#### 26 **§18906. Executive director**

28 The Executive Director of the Maine State Retirement System is the executive director of the system, referred to in this 30 chapter as the "executive director." The executive director has the same powers and duties with respect to the system as the 32 executive director has with the Maine State Retirement System, except as provided in this chapter.

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#### <u>\$18907. Actuary</u>

The actuary of the Maine State Retirement System is the 38 actuary of the system. The actuary has the same duties with respect to the system as the actuary has with the Maine State 40 Retirement System, except as provided in this chapter.

42 §18908. Administrative procedures

Appeal from the executive director's decision is the same as provided for the Maine State Retirement System in section 17451.

<u>§18909. Legal advisor</u>

The Attorney General or an assistant designated by the 50 Attorney General is the legal advisor of the board of trustees.

48	1. Payment. The State shall pay annually into the Maine
ΞU	Volunteer Firefighters Retirement System Fund an amount known as
50	the employer contribution.
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2. Employer contribution amount. The amount of the employer contribution is fixed on the basis of the assets and liabilities of the system as shown by actuarial valuation. The amount of the employer contribution is determined on actuarial bases adopted by the board of trustees. The amount is determined by the board of trustees after each valuation and is in force until a new valuation is made.

103. State contribution procedure. The board of trustees<br/>shall submit budget estimates to the State Budget Officer in<br/>accordance with section 1665. The State Controller shall cause a<br/>charge to be made against funds collected under the fire14insurance premium tax each month of an amount in payment of the<br/>state costs of all charges related to the system. The charge16must be credited to the appropriate accounts of the fund.

**4. Minimum amount of employer contribution.** The aggregate payment by the State into the fund must be at least sufficient, when combined with the amount in the fund, to provide the benefits payable out of the fund during the current year.

5. Contributions not compensation. Any contributions made and any benefits provided pursuant to this chapter may not be considered compensation and member firefighters are not deemed to be in the paid service of any governing body.
