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§18910.	Custodian	of	funds

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Except as otherwise provided, the Treasurer of State is the custodian of the funds of the system. Upon receipt of vouchers signed by a person or persons designated by the board, the State Controller shall draw a warrant on the Treasurer of State for the amount authorized. A duly attested copy of the resolution of the board designating those persons and bearing on its face their specimen signatures must be filed with the State Controller as the State Controller's authority for making payments upon the vouchers.

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\$18911. Expenses

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The State shall pay all the administrative expenses of the system.

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1. Kstimate funds biennially. Biennially, the board shall estimate the amount of money determined necessary by the board to provide for the expenses of administration and operation of the system during the ensuing biennium. The State shall pay that amount, for that purpose, into the fund established for that purpose.

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2. Balance. Any unexpended balance does not lapse, but constitutes a continuous carrying account.

\$18912. Investments

The board may combine funds from the system and the Maine
State Retirement System for investment purposes. The assets and
the funds of the Maine State Retirement System and the assets and
the funds of the system may not be combined for benefit payment
purposes or for administrative expenses.

\$18913. Funding by State

- 1. Payment. The State shall pay annually into the Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement Fund an amount known as the employer contribution.
- 2. Employer contribution amount. The amount of the employer contribution is fixed on the basis of the assets and liabilities of the system as shown by actuarial valuation. The amount of the employer contribution is determined on actuarial bases adopted by the board. The amount is determined by the board after each valuation and is in force until a new valuation is made.
- 50 <u>3. State contribution procedure. The board shall submit budget estimates to the State Budget Officer in accordance with</u>
 52 <u>section 1665. The State Controller shall cause a charge to be</u>

2	each month of an amount in payment of the state costs of all
	charges related to the system. The charge must be credited to
4	the appropriate accounts of the fund.
. б	4. Minimum amount of employer contribution. The aggregate payment by the State into the fund must be at least sufficient,
8	when combined with the amount in the fund, to provide the benefits payable out of the fund during the current year.
10	5. Contributions not compensation. Any contributions made
12	and any benefits provided pursuant to this chapter may not be considered compensation and member firefighters are not deemed to
14	be in the paid service of any governing body.
16	§18914. Maine Volunteer Firefighters Retirement Board of Directors
18	1. Appointment of members. The members of the Maine
20	<u>Volunteer Firefighters Retirement Board of Directors are appointed by the executive boards of the Maine Fire Chiefs</u>
22	Association and the Maine State Federation of Firefighters, Inc.
24	2. Duties. The duties of the board of directors are to:
26	A. Certify to the executive director the names of departments and firefighters' associations that have been
28	accepted to be member fire departments;
30	B. Certify to the executive director the names, dates of birth, sex and any other information required by the
32	executive director for the proper administration of the plan, of persons qualified to be members;
34	C. Certify to the executive director the number of years of
36	continuous qualified service of each member as of each June 30th;
38	D. Establish regional boards; and
40	E. Hear appeals from its decisions relating to eligibility
42	and qualified service. After a decision has been appealed and a hearing has been held the decision of the board of
44	directors is final and is not subject to further appeal.
46	§18915. Participation
48	Participation in the system is optional. Any governing body may apply to the appropriate regional board requesting that its
50	department or firefighters association be permitted to
52	participate in the system. Upon acceptance of the application by the regional board and the Maine Volunteer Firefighters

2	director, the department or association shall be deemed to be a
4	member fire department.
	§18916. Prior service
б	Upon full payment of the required contributions, a member
8	firefighter must be granted credit for one year of qualified
10	service for each year of prior service approved by the board of directors.
12	1. Amount of contributions. The amount of contributions is based upon the rate of contributions, plus interest, made by the
14	State during the first year of the system.
16	A. Payment or payments must be made as provided in section 17701, subsection 4 for members of the Maine State
18	Retirement System.
20	B. Interest must be at the same rate members of the Maine State Retirement System are required to pay with relation to
22	payment of back contributions by section 17704, subsection 3.
24	C. Interest is computed from the date of establishment of

28	2. Continuous service. A member firefighter must have completed 5 continuous years of qualifying service to be eligible
30	for prior service credit.

36	A member firefighter is entitled to receive a monthly retirement benefit upon reaching retirement age, subject to the
38	vesting provisions in section 18919. The monthly benefits
40	payments are made for the number of continuous years of qualified service as follows:

24	No right to retirement benefits vests until 5 continuous years of qualified service are completed.

28	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

32	STATEMENT OF FACT
34	This bill establishes the Maine Volunteer Firefighters
36	Retirement System to provide pension and death benefits for member firefighters.
