Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, Public Law 1989, chapter 931 establishes a medical liability demonstration project which is to begin by January 1, б 1992; and Whereas, the purpose of this legislation is to add the 10 specialty of radiology to the medical liability demonstration project; and 12 Whereas, in order to include radiology in the medical liability demonstration project beginning January 1, 1992, it is 14 necessary to begin the process of developing practice parameters and protocols for radiology immediately; and 16 18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 20 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 24 26 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§58-D is enacted to read: 28 58-D. 6	STATEMENT OF FACT
8	This bill includes radiology in the medical liability demonstration project which is scheduled to begin on January 1,
10	1992. The specialties of obstetrics and gynecology, anesthesiology and emergency medicine are already included in the
12	demonstration project.
14	The addition of radiology to the demonstration project is compatible with the objectives of the project. It provides an
16	opportunity to adapt and utilize practice standards that have been developed by the American College of Radiology with the goal
18	of improving the practice of radiology and reducing the cost of liability insurance.
