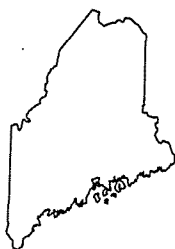

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22       §6462-A. Lobster and Shellfish Advisory Commission

24       The Lobster and Shellfish Advisory Commission is established  
25       to help conserve and promote the prosperity and welfare of the  
26       State and its citizens and the lobster and shellfish industries  
27       that help support the citizens of the State.

28       1. Appointment; composition. The Lobster and Shellfish  
29       Advisory Commission, established by Title 5, section 12004-I,  
30       subsection 91, consists of 13 members. Each member must be  
31       appointed by the Governor as follows:

32       A. From each of the following counties, one person who  
34       holds a lobster and crab fishing license:

36            (1) Cumberland;

38            (2) Hancock;

40            (3) Knox;

42            (4) Lincoln;

44            (5) Sagadahoc;

46            (6) Waldo;

48            (7) Washington; and

50            (8) York;
