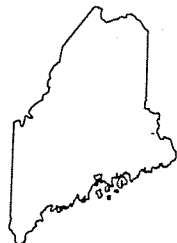

(EMERGENCY)



2 Provides funds to the Special Committee on
4 the New Capitol Area Master Plan for phase 2
6 activities in fiscal year 1991-92 including
a facilities plan, a physical master plan, a
management plan and other related studies.

8 **Sec. 3. Retroactivity. Resolved:** That section 1 of this resolve
10 is retroactive to January 15, 1991.

12 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the
14 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

16 STATEMENT OF FACT

18 As anticipated in the master planning process which was
20 prepared by the master planner and reviewed by the Special
22 Committee for the New Capitol Area Master Plan, substantial
24 additional work needs to be accomplished in order for the master
26 plan to be completed. A Progress Report and Initial
Recommendations was issued by the master planner and the special
committee on January 15, 1991. In that report, a number of
actions are recommended for consideration and funding by the
Legislature. This resolve provides the additional time and funds
that are necessary to complete the master plan.
