SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 508, L.D. 1346, Bill, "An Act to Place Certain Lands Recommended by the Special Committee on the New Capitol Area Master Plan under the Jurisdiction of the Capitol Planning Commission"

Amend the amendment by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 3. Lease interest preserved. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, chapter 21; Title 3, chapter 31; and Title 5, chapter 14-A, the existing lease between the State, through the Bureau of Public Improvements and the Capitol Area Recreation Association for certain lands, including those occupied by the Maine Arboretum, within the Capitol Area on the east side of the Kennebec River continues in full force. The use of those lands, including the construction of new recreational facilities, by the Capitol Area Recreation Association, or its invitees, may not be impaired by any action of the Legislative Council, the State House and Capitol Park Commission or the Capitol Planning Commission.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds a provision to the committee amendment specifying that the lease held by the Capitol Area Recreation Association to certain state lands, including those occupied by the Maine Arboretum, which will be brought under the jurisdiction of the State House and Capitol Park Commission and the Capitol Planning Commission by the bill may not be impaired. The association and its invitees may continue to use these areas as provided by its lease, including the construction of additional recreational facilities.
