Lease interest preserved. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, chapter 21; Title 3, chapter 31; and 22 Title 5, chapter 14-A, the State, through the Bureau of Public Lands shall enter into new leases with the Capitol Area 24 Recreation Association and the Pine Tree State Arboretum for 26 certain lands now leased by those entities within the Capitol Area on the east side of the Kennebec River. The new leases must 28 be on the same terms and conditions as the current leases, except that they must be for a term of 99 years and must provide that 30 termination may only be effectuated by the mutual consent of the parties. The use of those lands now under lease, including the 32 construction of new recreational facilities, by the Capitol Area Recreation Association, the Pine Tree State Arboretum, or their 34 invitees, may not be impaired by any action of the Legislative Council, the State House and Capitol Park Commission or the 36 Capitol Planning Commission.' 38 STATEMENT OF FACT 40 42 This amendment adds a provision to the committee amendment specifying that the leases held by the Capitol Area Recreation

Association and the Pine Tree State Arboretum to certain state lands which will be brought under the jurisdiction of the State

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 508, L.D. 1346

House and Capitol Park Commission and the Capitol Planning Commission by the bill must be renewed on the same terms and conditions, except that the new leases must be for 99 years and be terminable only by mutual consent. The association, the arboretum and their invitees may continue to use these areas as provided by the leases, including the construction of additional recreational facilities.
