An Act to Increase the Fees for Dog Licenses.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
. 2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3923, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
4	383, §3, is amended to read:
6	A. A fee of \$5.50-shall <u>\$11 must</u> be paid to the municipal clerk for each license on all dogs 6 months of age or older
8	capable of producing young. All dogs shallbe are considered capable of producing young, unless:
10	(1) A veterinarian issues a written certificate
12	stating that he <u>the veterinarian</u> made the dog incapable of producing young by spaying, if female, or by
14	sterilization, if male;
16	(2) A veterinarian issues a written certificate that, upon his examination, the dog is incapable of producing
18	young; or
20	(3) By previous registration, the owner has declared that the dog is incapable of producing young.

24	When such certificate or registration accompanies the application, a fee of \$2-shall \$5 must be paid for each license and-kept-by-the-municipality-in-accordance-with

28	Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3923, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:
30	1-A. Distribution of fees. Notwithstanding section 3945, fees collected pursuant to subsection 1 must be allocated as

34	A. For dogs capable of producing young, \$1 to the clerk; \$6 to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources;
36	and \$4 to the animal control officer appointed by the municipality, except that if the municipality has no animal
38	control officer, that portion is retained by the clerk; and
40	B. For dogs certified as incapable of producing young, \$1 to the clerk and \$4 to the animal control officer appointed
42	by the municipality, except that if the municipality has no animal control officer, that portion is retained by the

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill doubles fees for licensing dogs and allocates the increased fee among the municipal clerk, the animal control officer and the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.
