	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
4	Whereas, the collection of evidence in cases of alleged
6 <sup>*</sup>	gross sexual misconduct is of vital importance in bringing the offender to justice; and

10	Whereas, the State does not currently have a standardized kit for hospitals to use in collecting evidence for cases of alleged gross sexual misconduct; and
12	Whereas, the collection of evidence varies from hospital to
14	hospital and may seriously damage the ability to successfully prosecute cases of alleged gross sexual misconduct; and

18	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
20	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

24	Sec. 1. Standardized kit. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services and the Department of Public Safety shall review evidence protocols for cases of gross sexual misconduct and
26	propose a standardized kit for the collection of evidence by hospitals in cases of alleged gross sexual misconduct; and be it

30	Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services and the Department of Public Safety shall submit their
32	report and proposal, along with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 115th
