COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 966, L.D. 1393, Bill, "An Act Increasing the Membership of the Nursing Home Administrators Licensing Board and Clarifying the Penalty for Unlicensed Practice"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 7. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This bill increases the membership of the Nursing Home Administrators Licensing Board and establishes a Class E crime for operating a medical care facility other than a hospital without holding a nursing home administrator's license.

Allocations of existing Other Special Revenue funds to the Nursing Home Administrators Licensing Board of \$920 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$920 in fiscal year 1992-93 are required for the per diem and expenses of an additional board member.

The additional work load and administrative costs associated with a minimal number of new cases filed in District Court as a result of the violations and the new cases filed in Superior Court for injunctive relief will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department.

Sentences imposed for a Class E offense must be served in a county jail facility. The projected cost to a county for each person sentenced under the new Class E crime is approximately \$3,820 and is based upon an average length of stay of 67 days.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
