Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 2 statement of fact the following: ·FISCAL NOTE 6 This bill requires the Department of Administration, Bureau of Purchases to review procurement and bid procedures to ensure 8 that recycled materials are purchased to the extent possible. This review can be absorbed within existing resources of the 10 Department of Administration. The bill also requires that all state agencies use composted and recycled organic materials to 12 the extent possible. Any costs associated with the use of these materials will be absorbed utilizing existing resources.' 14 16 STATEMENT OF FACT 18 This amendment deletes the purchase preference by the State 20 for paper or paper products with recycled content that have not been bleached with chlorine. It also deletes the provision that would, in the event of a tie bid, award the bid to the material 22 containing the highest post-consumer content and the product that 24 has not been bleached. 26 The amendment also: 28 Extends the requirement to use composted materials to all state agencies; 30 Includes the use in land maintenance activities of composted and recycled organic materials and reclaimed soil and 32 residuals; and 34 Extends the requirement that those materials be used in all construction activities paid for by public funds and all land 36 maintenance and construction activities that are awarded through grant-in-aid programs to municipalities. 38 40 The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
