18	Amend the bill by striking out all of subsection 4 (page 1, lines 5 to 11 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
20	'4. Confidentiality. Computer programs, technical data, logic diagrams and source code related to data processing or
22	telecommunications are confidential and are not public records as
44	defined in Title 1, section 402, subsection 3 to the extent of
24	the identified trade secrets. To qualify for confidentiality
44	under this subsection, computer programs, technical data, logic
26	diagrams and source code must:
