The term "income" includes all that is countable as income under laws and rules of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.
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This bill also maintains the eligibility of Aid to Families
with Dependent Children families for the Maine Residents Property
Tax Program but provides that payment of that benefit to those
families be made through the Aid to Families with Dependent
Children program to acquire the benefit of federal matching funds.
