#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to License Installers of Milking Equipment.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

7 MRSA §2909 is enacted to read:

§2909. Installers of milking equipment

1. Licensing. A person, firm or corporation that installs8or repairs milking equipment on farms shall apply annually to the<br/>commissioner for a license. For the purpose of this section,10"milking equipment" means pipeline milkers, in-line coolers,<br/>automatic takeoffs, stimulators and backflush systems. Before12granting a license to an applicant, the commissioner shall<br/>determine that the applicant is qualified to perform installation14and repair services. The application fee is \$25 per year.

16 2. Submission and approval of plans. Prior to the installation or repair of any milking equipment, a licensee under 18 this section shall submit a written plan or design to the commissioner for review and approval. A plan or design must be submitted at least 10 days prior to the date on which work is 20 expected to begin and the commissioner shall complete the review 22 within 10 days of receipt of the plan or design. Work may not commence until approval of the plan or design has been given by 24 the commissioner. The commissioner shall approve any plan or design that conforms with standards established by the commissioner by rulemaking in accordance with the Maine 26 Administrative Procedure Act.

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3. Suspension and revocation of license. The commissioner may suspend or revoke any license issued under this section after notice and an opportunity to be heard is provided in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act governing adjudicatory proceedings, upon a finding that any of the following has occurred.

 A. The licensee failed to submit a plan or design in accordance with subsection 2 prior to performing
installation or repair services.

 40 <u>B. The licensee completed an installation or repair project</u> in a manner that is substantially inconsistent with the
42 <u>approved plan or design.</u>

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

48 This bill requires that persons who install or repair milking equipment in this State be licensed. The bill requires 50 that minimum standards of competency be possessed by persons installing milking equipment and that installers submit plans or designs of proposed installations to the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources for review and approval. Plans and designs must be reviewed by the commissioner to determine conformance with established industry standards.

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
