STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the History, Status, Impact and Role of Independent Higher Education in Maine.

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Whereas, independent higher education plays a critical role in the State; and

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Whereas, more than 5,000 Maine students annually attend one of the 12 independent institutions of higher education in the State, many in programs not offered by the state-supported institutions; and

Whereas. Maine's future ability to be competitive 10 economically, financially and intellectually depends in large measure on the availability of quality higher education; now, 12 therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the History, Status, Impact and Role of Independent Higher Education in Maine is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 9 members appointed as follows.

1. The Governor shall appoint 3 members, one of whom must be a member of the Higher Education Council of Maine, one of whom must be a member of the Legislature and one of whom must be a business, education or community leader. Of these members, at least 2 must be graduates of independent institutions of higher education and at least 2 must be residents of the State.

2. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members, one of whom must be a member of the Legislature and 2 of whom must be business, education or community leaders. Of these members, at least 2 must be graduates of independent institutions of higher learning and at least 2 must be residents of the State. 32

The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 3 members, one of whom must be a member of the Legislature and 2 of whom must be business, 36 education or Of these members, at least 2 must be community leaders. graduates of independent institutions of higher education and at 38 least 2 must be residents of the State; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings; chair. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The commission shall select a chair from among its members. When the appointment of the members is completed, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting within 30 days; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the history, status, impact and role of independent higher

education in the State and make recommendations for the future role of these institutions. In conducting this study, the commission shall:

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1. Examine the historical significance of, as well as the current educational opportunities provided by, independent higher education for the people of this State, including program offerings available to the students of this State, the impact of research programs and teaching activities, the availability of facilities and community programs and student enrollments;

 Evaluate the capacity of independent higher educational institutions to meet future educational and economic needs of the
State and examine how these institutions may work together with state-supported institutions to better serve such needs;

Review the mechanisms by which independent higher
educational institutions can complement the State's public higher
education systems by providing education, research or other
services;

4. Evaluate the state student financial aid policy and practice and the extent to which it supports independent higher
educational institutions;

5. Analyze the relative cost of independent and public higher education with and without the support of public funds; and

 6. Make recommendations on how state policy and law may be
30 changed to provide a more meaningful role for independent higher educational institutions in state educational planning and
32 services; and be it further

34 Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, 36 to the First Regular Session of the 116th Legislature and the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council by 38 November 1, 1992; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may contract with a consultant to provide professional services in carrying out these duties. The consultant shall provide clerical assistance to the commission and shall prepare any legislation recommend by the commission. The chair of the commission shall manage the consultant's work; and be it further

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission who are not state employees may receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

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Sec. 8. Funding. Resolved: That the Legislative Council may seek outside sources of funding to finance the study provided in this resolve. The Legislative Council shall administer any outside funds acquired for the conduct of the study. Expenditures for the conduct of the study may not be incurred that have an impact on the General Fund. Expenditures may not be incurred relative to this study unless the funding from outside sources has been received by the Legislative Council.
