An Act to Establish a Scenic Roadway Designation in the State.



	Вe	it	enacted	bv	the	People	of	the	State	of	Maine	as	follows
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	23 MRSA §53, sub-§§1-A and 1-B are enacted to read:
4	1-A. Scenic roads or streets; designation. Any town way
6	may be designated as a scenic road or street in the following
	manner.
8	A. Upon petition of 10 persons who are registered voters in
10	the city or town or who are owners of property abutting a
10	road or street mentioned in the petition, the voters of the
12	city or town may at the next scheduled municipal election
16	designate the road or street as a scenic road or street.
14	The petitioners are responsible for providing the town clerk
	with a list of known owners of property abutting any road or
16	street mentioned in the petition. The town clerk shall
	notify by regular mail within 10 days of the filing all
18	owners of property abutting the road or street for which a
	scenic road or street petition has been filed that a
20	proposal to designate that road or street as a scenic road
	or street will appear on the ballot of the next scheduled
22	municipal election.
24	B. The voters of the city or town may rescind their
	designation of a road or street as a scenic road or street
26	by following the petition process provided in paragraph A.
	The same notice provisions apply.

	1-B. Effect of designation as scenic road or street. The
30	effect of designation under subsection 1-A is as follows.
32	A. As used in this subsection, "tree" means any woody plant
	that has a circumference of 15 inches or more at a point 4
34	feet above the ground.
36	B. Once a road or street has been designated as a scenic
	road or street, any repair, maintenance, reconstruction or
38	paving work on that road or street may not involve the
	cutting or removal of trees or the destruction of stone
40	walls or a portion of a stone wall except with the prior
_	written consent of the municipal officers. Portions of
42	trees, shrubs, vegetation and other natural or artificial
	obstructions within 3 feet of the main traveled portion of a
44	scenic road or street that interfere with safe travel upon
16	the road or street may be removed without municipal consent.
46	C. The municipal officers shall hold a public hearing prior
48	to acting on a request for municipal consent. The time,
±0	date, place and topic of the hearing must be advertised
50	twice in a newspaper of general circulation serving the
	municipality at least 7 days before the hearing. In

	emergency situations, trees may be cut or removed with the
2	written consent of the municipal officers without a public
	<u>hearing.</u>

_	D. Designation of a road or street as scenic may not affect
6	the eligibility of the municipality to receive construction,
_	maintenance or reconstruction aid pursuant to sections 1801
8	to 1806.
10	E. Designation of a road or street as scenic may not affect
	the rights of owners of property abutting the scenic road or
12	street to perform other work on their own property.

16	STATEMENT OF FACT
10	DEVETEDIVED AT A LACT
18	This bill creates a scenic road or street designation in the
10	State. Once a road or street has received scenic designation,
20	the consent of the municipal officers is required before mature
20	trees and stone walls may be removed along that road or street.
22	This bill is modeled after a similar provision of New Hampshire
	law.
