Sec. 1. 39 MRSA §92, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 601, §4, is amended to read:

2. Employees. The ehairman <u>chair</u> shall appoint an assistant to-the-chairman, who shall-serves serves at his <u>the</u> <u>chair's</u> pleasure. Subject to the Personnel <u>Civil Service</u> Law, the ehairman <u>chair</u> shall appoint a Director-of-Administrative Services <u>commission administrator</u>, full-time or part-time reporters and such legal, professional and clerical assistants as may be necessary.

Sec. 2. 39 MRSA 104-A, sub-3, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 77, 6, is amended to read:

3. Certificate. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rule of evidence, the certificate of the Director--of Administrative-Services clerk of the commission, under seal of the commission, shall must be received in any court in this State as prima facie evidence of facts pertaining to insurance coverage records contained in the certificate or within the documents attached to the certificate.

STATEMENT OF FACT

A recent reclassification by the Bureau of Human Resources of 2 positions within the Workers' Compensation Commission has caused the titles and duties of those 2 positions to change. The purpose of this bill is to bring the Workers' Compensation Act into conformity with these changes.
