An Act to Protect Consumers and Provide Access to Information.



Вe	it	enacted	by	the	People	of	the	State	of	Maine	as	follows:

Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2503, sub-§3, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1977, c.
4 492, §3, is amended to read:

C. A system for the continuous collection of data with respect to the provider's experience with negative health care outcomes and incidents injurious to patients, whether or not they give rise to claims, patient grievances, claims, suits, professional liability premiums, settlements, awards, allocated and administrative costs of claims handling, costs of patient injury prevention and safety engineering activities, and other relevant statistics and information; and

Sec. 2. 24 MRSA §2503, sub-§3, ¶E is enacted to read:

E. An information mechanism designed to provide victims of medical injury with a complete legible copy of all incident reports relating to the medical injury and the opportunity of the victim, the family of the victim and the victim's representative to attend and participate in the quality review meetings and meetings to determine the necessity of medical care called to review the professional services rendered to the patient; and

Sec. 3. 24 MRSA §2510, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1985, c. 185, §3, is repealed.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill allows a victim of medical injury the opportunity to participate in medical peer review relating to that injury and to receive a complete legible copy of the hospital incident report reporting the medical injury.

The bill also repeals a provision that made confidential information under the Maine Health Security Act, Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24, section 2501, unavailable for an action relating to the provision or failure to provide health services.

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
