An Act to Regulate Fines for Prohibited Acts Concerning the Use of Public Ways and Parking Areas Maintained by the State.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

24	This bill provides greater enforcement power to a state institution under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-B by
26	raising the fines for traffic offenses to be consistent with those charged by the municipality in which the state institution
