An Act Concerning Beano or Bingo.

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §311, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 272, is amended to read:

1. Beano. "Beano" shall-mean means a specific kind of group game of chance, regardless of whether such a game is characterized by another name. Wherever the term "beano" is used, the word "bingo" or any other word used to characterize such a game may be interchanged. In "beano," each participant is given or sold one or more tally cards, so-called, each of which contains numbers or letters and may or may not be arranged in vertical or horizontal rows. The participant covers the numbers or letters as objects similarly numbered or lettered are drawn from a receptacle, and the game is won by the person who first covers a previously designated arrangement of numbers or letters on the tally card.

A. "Beano" may also mean a game whereby a participant may
win by not having any of the numbers or letters called.
This game may be known as "hard-luck" or "stand-up" beano.

- B. For purposes of this chapter, a blank tally card to be filled in by an individual beano participant with the participant's choice of numbers is deemed to be a beano game as defined by this section.
- C. For purposes of this chapter, prizes may be awarded to the persons sitting to the left or right of a beano game winner as a so-called "good neighbor" game.
 - D. For purposes of this chapter, any predetermined number or letter, or both, may be announced prior to the start of any one game. Such a number or letter may be used by the caller in determining the winning configuration of a game.

Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §312, 2nd ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 449, §1, is amended to read:

"Beano" or "Bingo" shall may not be conducted on Christmas. "Beano" or "Bingo" may be played on Sunday after the hour of 12 neen 11 a.m. No "Beano" or "Bingo" games may be conducted between the hours of 12 midnight and 7 a.m. The prevailing time for the State of Maine shall must be used to determine these hours.

Term of license; fees. A license issued under this section is valid for a period of 6 months. The annual license fee for a high-stakes beano license is 5%--of-gross-revenues \$50,000. The fee is payable in monthly installments based-on-5% of-the-gross-revenues-of-the-previous-month. All license fees shall must be paid to the Treasurer of State to be credited to the General Fund.

3. Lucky seven. Lucky seven or similar sealed tickets may be sold when that game of chance is licensed by the Chief of the State Police and when a valid license certificate is properly displayed. Notwithstanding this section and section 312, Lucky seven games may be conducted during the period of 2 hours before and 2 hours after any "Beano" game and also may be conducted during the-intermission-of any "Beano" game.

A. Notwithstanding any rule, lucky seven or other similar sealed tickets may be sold that have a sale value of \$1 or less.

Sec. 6. PL 1987, c. 197, §7 is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 6	This bill authorizes popular variations on the game of beano not currently allowed under the statutes and rules adopted by the Chief of the State Police.
8	The bill authorizes beano licensees to conduct high-stakes games beginning one hour earlier on Sundays.
10	
12	The bill provides for expanded sessions of high-stakes beano games from 18 to 36 weekends per year for the Penobscot Nation. It also provides for consecutive weekend games in the time period
14	from April to October, so that the warmer weather and the tourist
16	season may be utilized to increase attendance at the games. The bill also authorizes rescheduling of high-stake beano
18	games cancelled due to inclement weather.
20	The bill changes the license fee for high-stakes beano from 5% of gross revenues to \$50,000 annually.

24	The bill provides for the sale of lucky seven or other similar sealed tickets during the conduct of the game session and
	also allows for the sale of such tickets with a sale value of \$1
26	or less.
28	The sunset clause of the original high-stakes beano games is repealed.
