4. Meetings. The council shall meet on a regular basis.

14 <u>5. Chair. The council shall select a chair from among its</u> members and the chair shall serve for a term established by the 16 <u>council.</u>

 18 6. Subcommittees. The council may appoint subcommittees to carry out its work. Subcommittee membership may include
20 representatives of public and private agencies that serve youth and families and other persons with special knowledge of,
22 responsibilities for or interest in an area related to the goals of the council.

 7. Report. The council shall report annually to the
Legislature on its progress in meeting the goals cited in subsection 4 and its proposal for implementing these same goals
28 in the coming year.

30 8. Administration. The costs associated with the council must be shared among the members of the council. Nothing in this 32 section may be construed to prohibit a member department or division from assigning its employees to serve as staff to the 34 council. The Department of Human Services shall serve as fiscal agent for the council.

 9. Authorization to accept funds. The Department of Human
38 Services may accept, on behalf of the council, funds from the Federal Government, from any political subdivision of the State
40 or from any individual, foundation or corporation and may expend these funds for purposes that are consistent with this section.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
